INDEXING MATTERS

1. HISTORICAL RECORDS
 With census, census forms, and other important documents stored in libraries and government offices around the world, these are usually inaccessible and hard to read for people in need.

2. DIGITAL CONVERSION
 Records that have generated information are digitized, photographed and published in FamilySearch.org for the access of the people found in the future. The records included in the images are all our records available.

3. INDEXING
 "Indexing" is the process of "indexing" or "tagging" records from the right regions under the individual family, the names and dates, available. This means which people you can find in with in, that what you can find with, and what you can find with. A helpful person called an "indexer" can help you work on the images and records.

4. ONLINE ACCESS
 Records that are indexed records are added in a searchable database in FamilySearch.org. The database helps people quickly and easily find records with important information when they access.

5. TEMPLE ORDINANCES
 People use the database to find the names of and information about their ancestors. They will be able to find FamilySearch Family Tree and can then make sure the people's temple ordinances are completed.

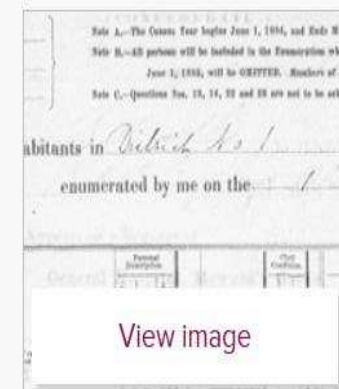

The Columbarium



The Columbarium at Black Mountain Presbyterian Church was begun as a part of our most recent building addition in 1993. The Session decreed that the Columbarium could not be a “moneymaking” operation of the Church. The committee reports to the Session via the Property Ministry Team.

Presently the Columbarium is comprised of three Niche Units (A, B, and C) with a total of 224 Niches, and one Plaque Unit (P) with 56

Plaques. As of November 1, 2012, there is one Niche each in Units B and C that are not subscribed and only 15 of 80 in Unit A that are subscribed. Plaque Unit P has 45 of 56 spaces subscribed. There is room for expansion. Niche units B and C, \$200 per niche; Niche unit A, \$400 per niche, Plaque unit P, \$100 per space. Niche units A, B, and C are for the storage of cremains. Plaque unit P is for those who are interred elsewhere but wish to be remembered at Black Mountain Presbyterian Church.

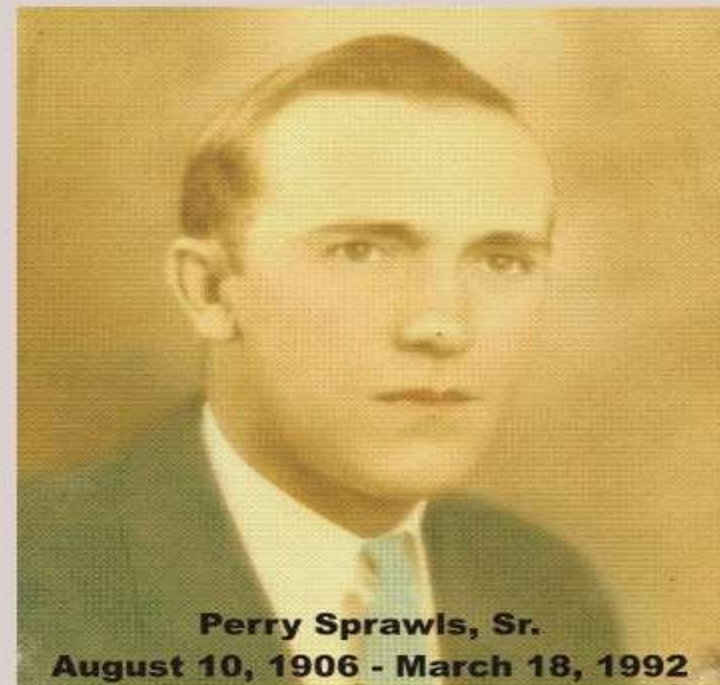

Perry Sprawls, Sr. was born and lived most of his life on the Sprawls Heritage Farm near Williston in Barnwell County, SC. The state of South Carolina designated it as one of its Heritage Farms because it has been in the Sprawls Family since 1812. It was still owned and operated by the Sprawls Family in 2012, after 200 years. Perry inherited the farm in the 1930s and operated it for many years. The house on the farm was built in 1856 and escaped being burned by the Union Army because here was someone ill in the house. All of the farm buildings were burned. This was witnessed by his father, Richard Sprawls, a young boy at the time, who always remembered the soldiers stole his pony. In 1932 a young nurse, Neva Ione Mathis, from Augusta, GA came to the farm to provide care for Perry's mother at the end of her life. Neva and Perry were married in 1933. Because of his interest in providing quality education he served as a school trustee for many years. First in the 1930s, for the small one-room and one-teacher Tinkers Creek School near the farm and then the consolidated Williston-Elko District until 1957, when his youngest child, Emily, graduated. For many years he operated three farms with melons, peanuts and cotton as the major crops. The home farm also included a dairy

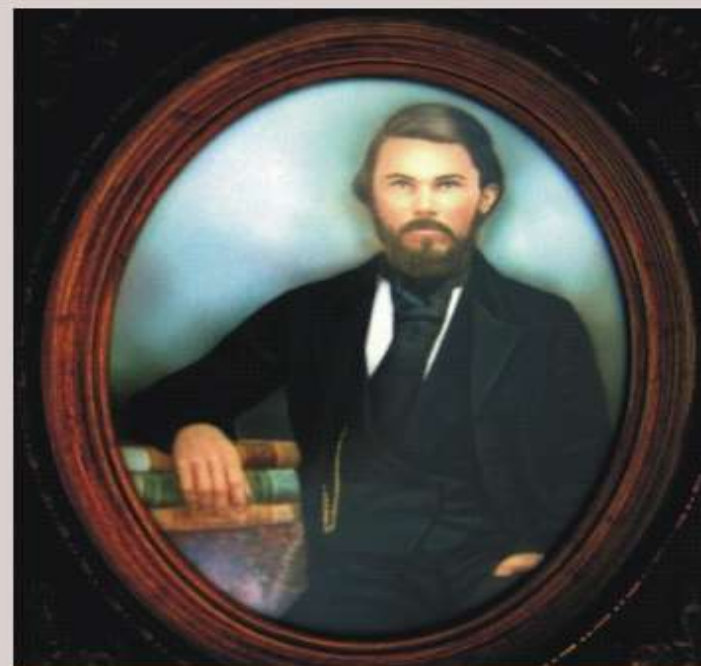

Medical College of Georgia.—The course of Lectures in this Institution was closed on the last day of February, after a session of four months, during which there occurred not the slightest incident to mar the good feeling which prevailed between the Faculty and Students, nor to lessen the high esteem in which the class has ever been held by the community. There were in attendance 159 gentlemen, of whom 127 were from Georgia, 13 from Alabama, 12 from South Carolina, 3 from Mississippi, 1 from Ohio, 1 from Tennessee, 1 from North Carolina, 1 from Kentucky, and 1 from Arkansas.

Fifty members of the class, having complied with all the requisitions of the College, were graduated on the 4th day of March. The Doctorate having been conferred by Ex-Governor Schley, a very appropriate, chaste and creditable address was delivered by Dr. C. T. 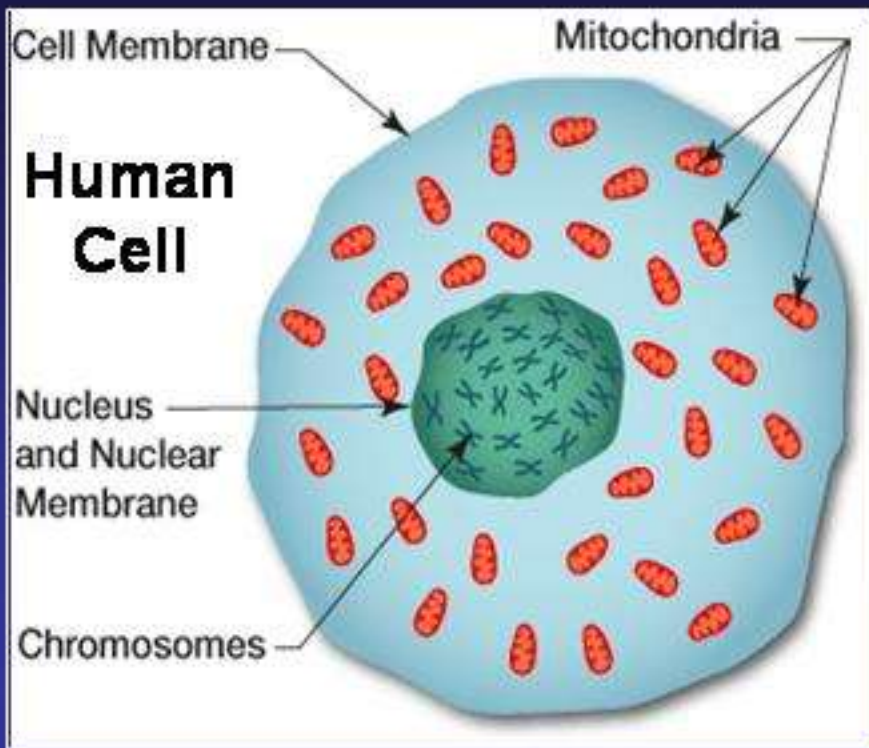

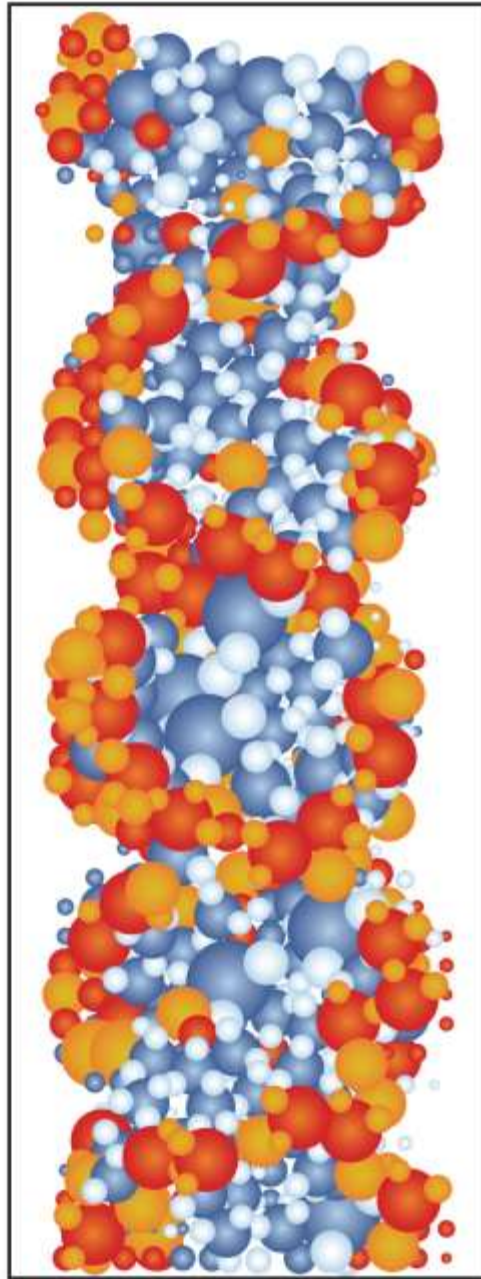

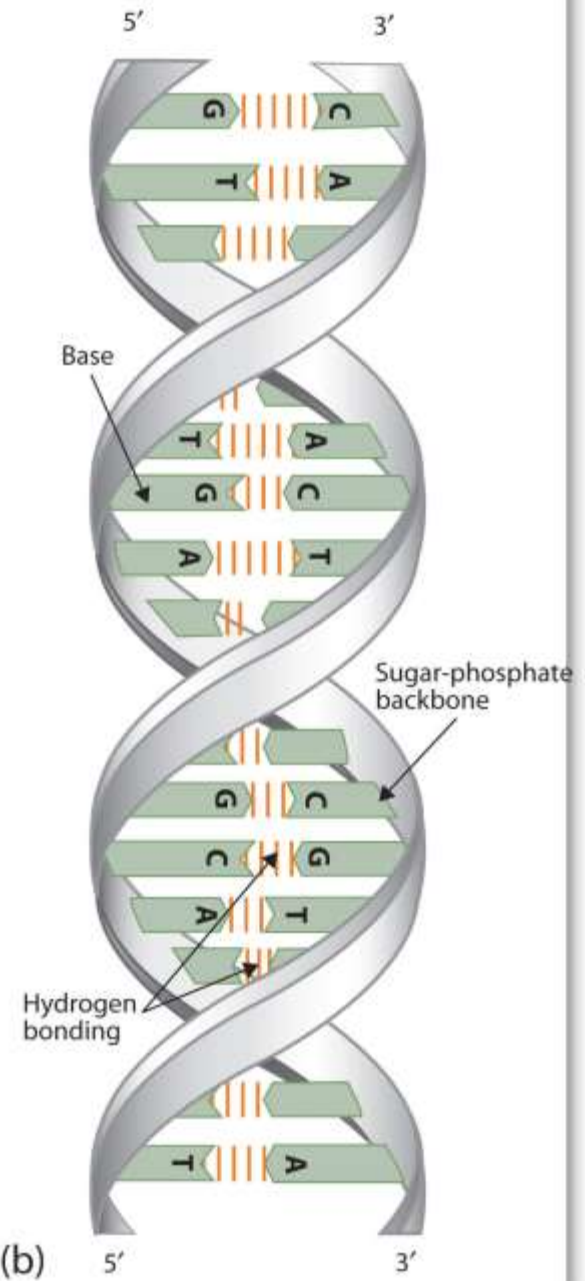

DNA is found in every cell in your body except red blood cells. The nucleus of cells contain chromosomes, and chromosomes are coiled up DNA. (In other words, chromosomes are DNA.) Humans have a total of 46 chromosomes, which are grouped into pairs. Each of the 23 pair consists of one chromosome from our mother and one from our father. World Map of Y-Chromosome Haplogroups

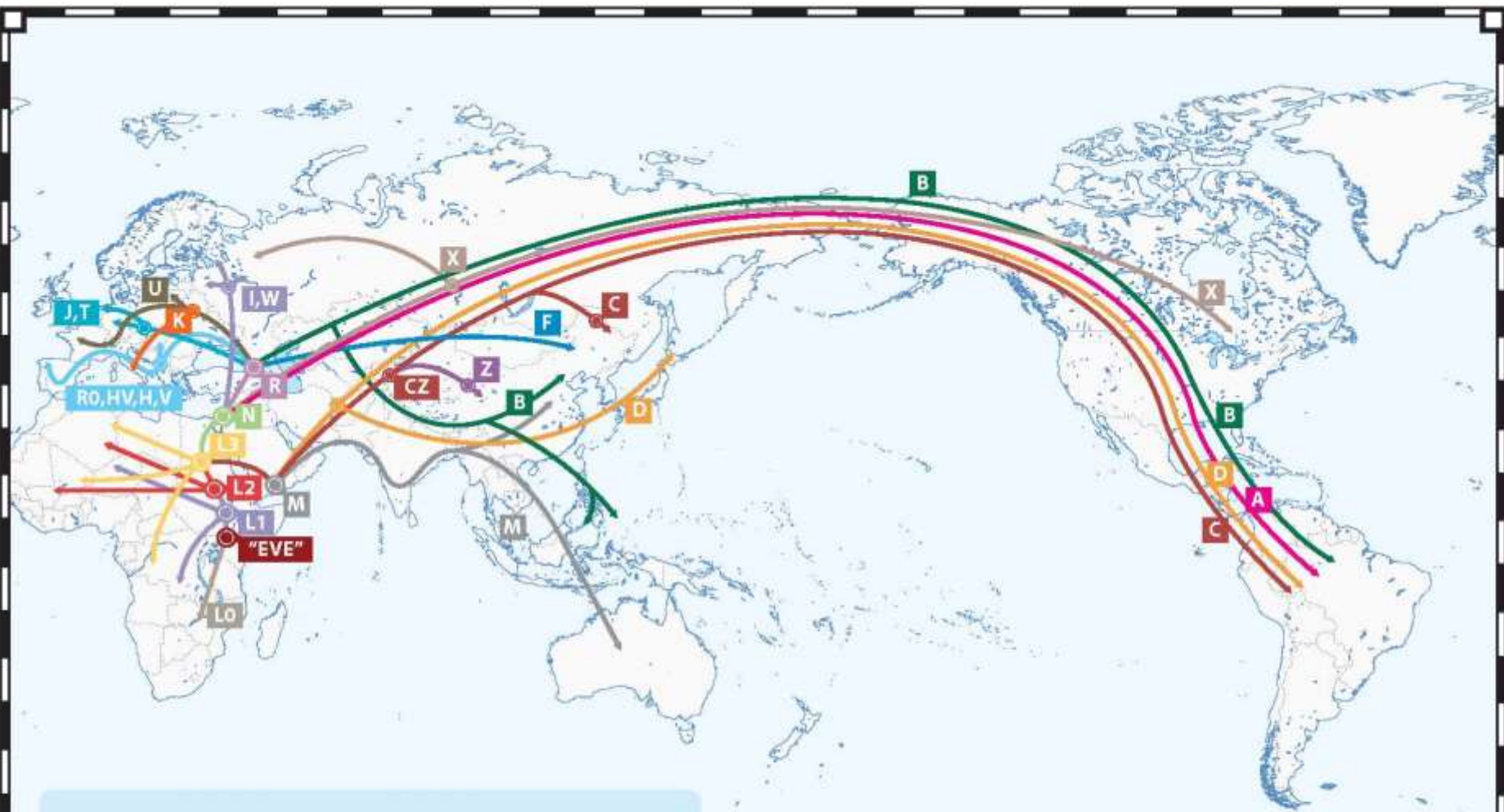
Dominant Haplogroups in Pre-Colonial Populations

with Possible Migrations Routes





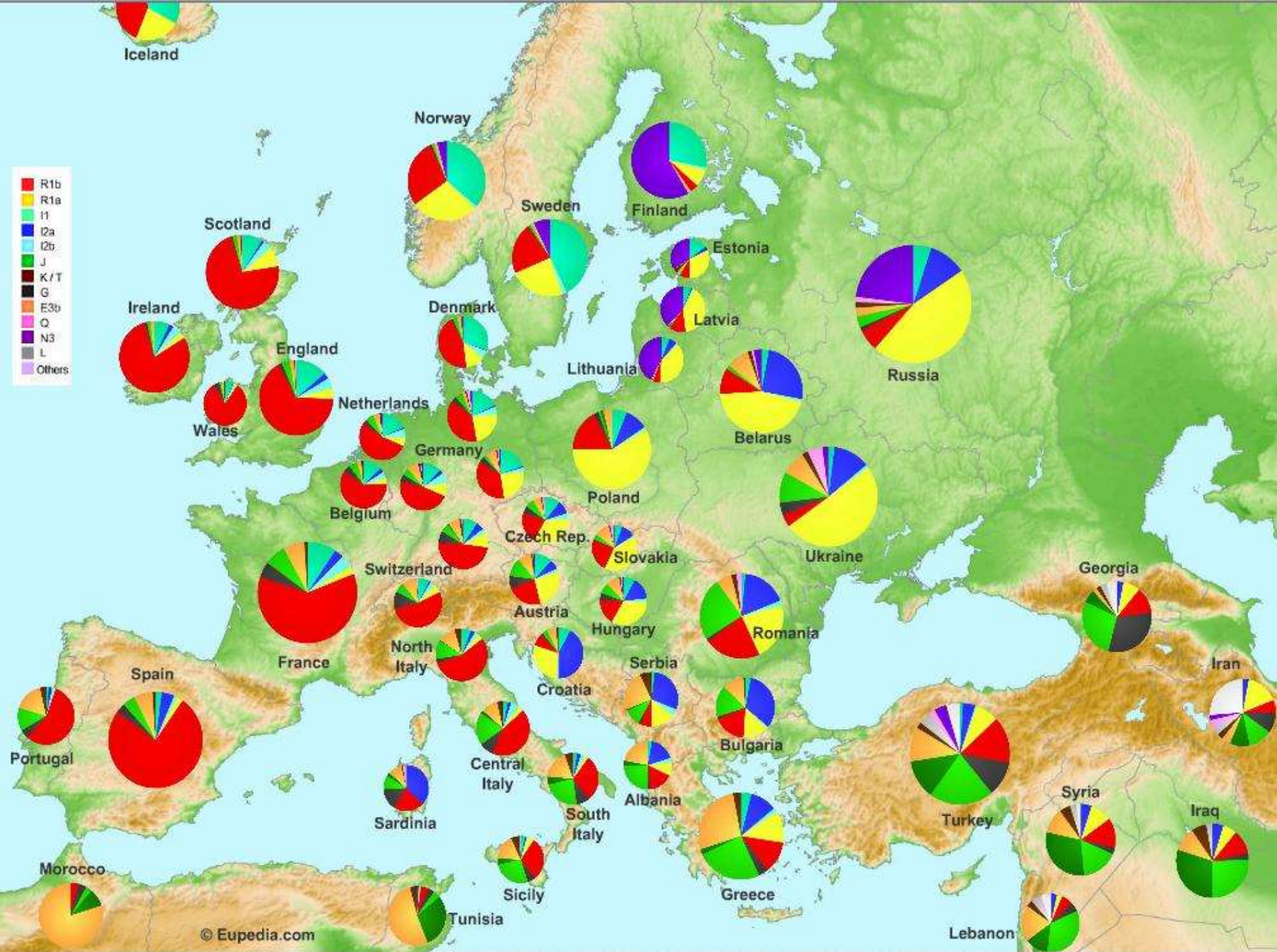


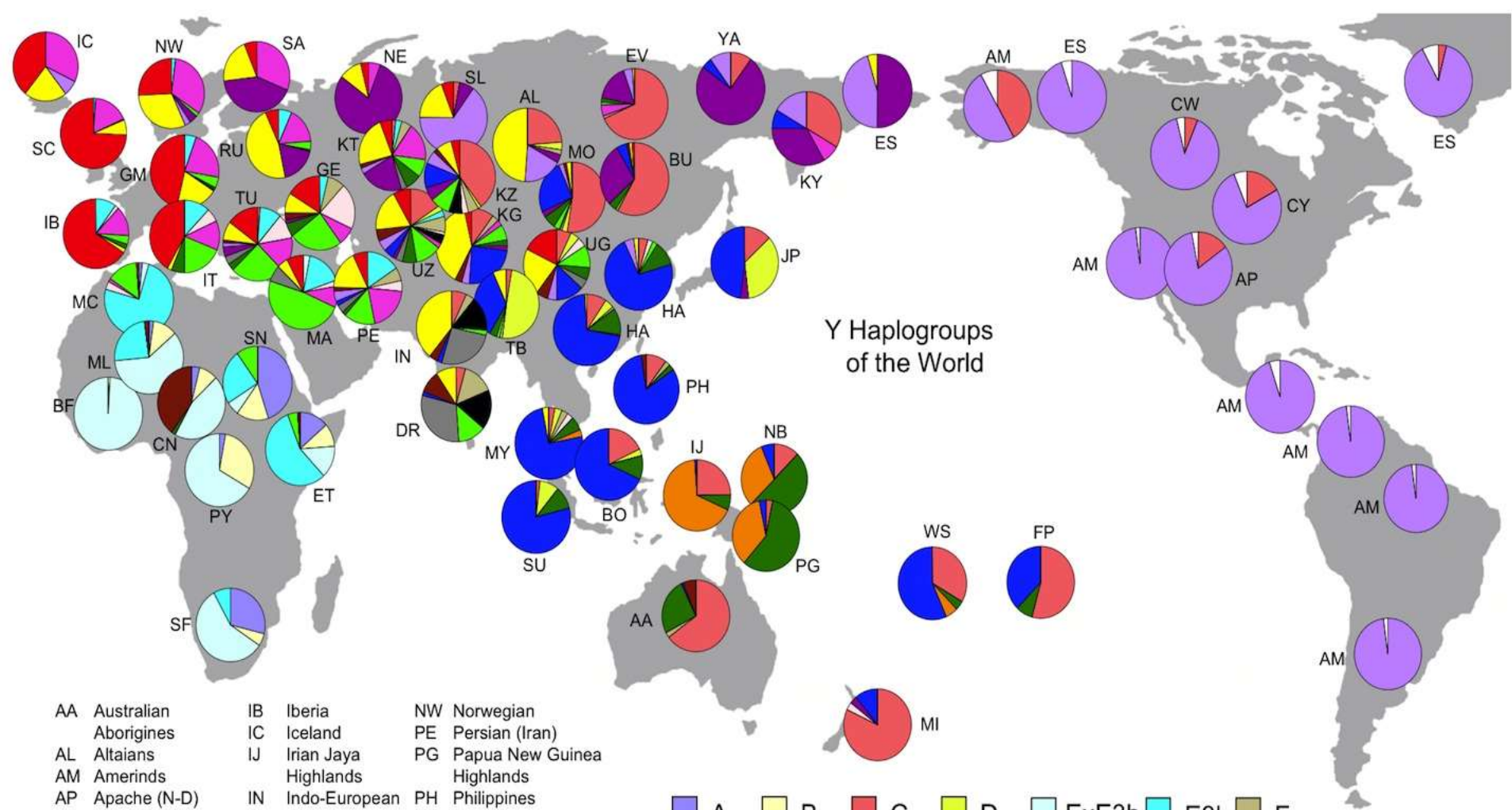

The data in this map is supposed to represent the situation before the recent European expansion beginning about 1500 AD. In some cases such as some Native American tribes and the Maori this can be done reliably because STR typing was done. In other cases, especially in America, it is guesswork. The "Other" sectors in America indicate this. Native American groups are labeled by language group as Amerind, Na-Dene (N-D), and Eskimo. F, K, L, and P are in some cases "catchall" groups because some researchers did not use enough markers for a full haplotype determination.
